
Savor the Summer August 2025

Museum on the Registry of National Historic Buildings






250 Years of History

Officer Monthly Comment

My Thoughts by Don McFeeters Board President

It is time to celebrate the efforts of the many members of the Sheldon Historical Society. Much has been accomplished with much more to come.

The HH Mower General Store building has been renovated and placed on the National Historic Registrar as a historic place.

So far, the following actions have occurred.

- Hundreds of hours of labor by volunteers and paid contractors
- Funding by the taxpayers of Sheldon
- Tickets purchased to support our Calcutta fundraisers
- Single donations from friends and visitors
- Several grants in the past and most recently \$50K from the Preservation Trust of Vermont. This most recent grant has allowed us to build the exterior staircase, refurbish the second floor of 200 Bridge Street and create the handicap entrance
- A grant from the Vermont Art Council has been recently received to install mini-splits for the benefit of better air and heat

Our next step is to complete the finishing of the 1st and 2nd floors. The Board has named the second floor as the "Community Memorial Center", already being used as a gathering place. We are open Thursdays and Saturdays, 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM, so stop in, visit, and see what the hours of labor, the donations by many, and the taxpayers have done. At the same time, take in some of the history of Sheldon. It is important for all of us to see where Sheldon has been and it gives us an understanding of how the Town has arrived at this point in time.

A small group is now visiting and working on bringing the gardens back to life and making them an important part of the property. The old Town Clerk's office, downstairs in the building will be next for major work. To continue to build our Collections, we are prepared to receive additional artifacts, photos, and printed material that will help us all to better understand the history; whether we are visitors, students in school, a senior who has lived in the Town for many years or a recent newcomer.

We want to say thank you to those families who have given to the Society's, "Memorial Gifts". These gifts are extremely beneficial as we complete the renovation of the H H Mower General Store, the operation of the Museum and upkeep of the building. Please visit with members of the Board, how your family can best accomplish this recognition.

As some may not know me, I was brought up on a farm In Sheldon, graduate of the Sheldon Springs School, and have been a member of the Board of Directors of the Sheldon Historical Society for many years. I currently live in St. Albans. The extended McFeeters family has had a long-time history of Town government involvement, farm owners, and a lifetime employee and manager of the paper mill.

To everyone involved, we all say thank you.
